# **MEETING NOTES**

Our March 25 meeting was cancelled due to the state mandate and the closing of our meeting place at the VFW until the mass gathering restriction is lifted by Oneida County Executive and the Governor, which currently is May 15. **So, the meeting for April 22 is cancelled.** The meetings were cancelled but there is still some ATV news to pass on in this newsletter.

There are still currently two club positions open, President and Secretary. As an official or volunteer, your involvement in the club helps determine our future decisions.

The Oneida County ATV Trails are closed until the state mass gathering order is cancelled by the county executive and governor.

The status of our goal to extend the Lewis County Trail System down to the village of Boonville continues but no status as there was no meetings.

The trail expansion of the NOCATVCLUB trails for a connector trail between our current trail parcels is still being reviewed by the landowner.

A number of years ago, the club trails extended into the Town of Forestport. A lawsuit was filed by a landowner against the town charging the town did not follow the procedures in opening the roads to ATVs. We are waiting for the Forestport town board to push this forward and schedule a public meeting. If your in the town of Forestport, contact the town supervisor or town board members to act on this request to get it moving. We still have not heard any progress on this by the town board.

As in getting any ATV trails, it takes a long time and dedicated effort by clubs to get the required permissions from the landowner(s), village, town, county or state organizations. # ANNUAL PERMIT

The new Lewis County Trail System permit site is <u>Lewis County Trail Permit</u> and is online. The major change on the website is to be entitled to the permit discount, you need to prove club membership in a club. If you purchased your club membership from us prior to your Lewis County Trail Permit, to receive the \$20 discount on your first annual permit, you will need to upload your 2020 NOCATVCLUB membership card . If you join us during your purchase of the Lewis County ATV Trail permit, no upload of proof is required.

When you fill out the online Lewis County Annual Trail Permit form, you may join NOCATVCLUB at that time to receive the discount. Please allow ample processing time (up to a month or so) for the club to receive your information from Lewis County and process your application and get your card and decal(s) to you.

Lewis County Annual Trail permits can still be purchased in person at the sellers listed on the Lewis County web page <a href="here">here</a>. Bring your 2020 NOCATVCLUB membership card with you to receive your \$20 discount when purchasing your first Lewis County Annual Trail Permit from these sellers or joining there.

#### LOCAL LAW 3

In the fall of 2019, the Lewis County legislature renewed the local law that provided the legal rules for the Lewis County Trail System. The revised law has changes that you as an operator should be aware of. Generally, if your off road vehicle is 1000 lbs or less there is no changes. Over 1000 lb vehicles are addressed in regards to the trail system. Some private owners will not allow the larger vehicles to ride the trail on their private property. Therefore, this sign may be posted at trail heads stating 1000lb weight limit. Please follow this weight limit or risk losing the trail for everyone by the landowner.



#### **EVENT PERMIT**

In February, the Lewis County legislature introduced a resolution to require a permit for organizations that plan on holding events in the county. This will apply to ATV and snowmobile clubs, among others. This may impact some atv events since permit fees and insurance to cover damages may eat into any profits clubs may earn while holding events. For NOCATVCLUB, this has no impact, since all of our club trails are in Northern Oneida County. We hope it does not deter our neighboring clubs, businesses or fire departments from holding poker runs, club sponsored family rides, etc.

# TRAIL LOST DUE TO DISRESPECTFUL RIDER(S)

Lewis County ATV Trail System April 14, 2020 at 8:40 AM

TRAIL CLOSURE - I [Jackie Mahoney] am saddened to report that we have lost a vital trail in our system. The trail between the Railroad bed, behind RVI to the Burdicks Crossing Road is CLOSED. One of our landowners has had enough of the arrogance (his words) of the riders who will not respect the trail closed signs. So we no longer have a legal connection to Brantingham. Unfortunately the actions of a few that feel the laws do not apply to them have impacted us all. Respect our landowners, your actions have consequences.

We are working on other options but that will take at least until June 3rd to be approved. I will try to keep you updated.

LOWVILLE — A landowner in Lyons Falls pulled out of the Lewis County ATV trail system because of the

"arrogance" of some riders, but a fix is already in the works.

Landowners and farmers Ricky J. Ehlers and Nancy B. Cook informed county Recreation Forestry and Parks Director Jackie Mahoney they would no longer allow ATVs to ride on the 778 feet of trail crossing their land because too many "arrogant" riders ignored signs indicating the trails are closed and rode on it anyway. Again.

Mrs. Mahoney said problematic riders going on closed trails aren't exclusive to this section of trail.

"We've seen one post that said the trail is closed and people made the effort to lay it on the ground and ride over it on the closed trail anyway," she said, "It's the people that are riding anywhere they want that are ruining it for everyone else."

Mr. Ehlers pulled yellow marking tape across the trail in addition to the "trail closed" sign posting, but riders drove through the tape, Mrs. Mahoney said.

Now he has stretched neon orange snow fencing across the trail with the bright yellow "trail closed" sign mounted in front to make his final point clear: his land is off limits.

The 3,862 feet of trail that intersects with Burdicks Crossing Road, goes over the railroad bed and behind River Valley Inn and, including the stretch on Mr. Ehlers and Ms. Cook's land, allows riders to reach the Brantingham area trails.

"We respect landowners," Mrs. Mahoney said of those that voluntarily allow ATV trails across their property, "They have all of the rights. We only have a contract agreement to use the land but they can withdraw at any time."

In most cases, she said landowners contact her about issues and she and her team "try to do everything [they] can to work with them."

For River Valley Inn owners Chef Andrew and Megan Zuccaro, local residents for the past 12 years, allowing the section of trail that brings the majority of their customers to their door to fall apart wasn't an option, especially now that they have only been able to do business via takeout for so long.

"People are coming for takeout but here in our area, there isn't a big population and we're not built for takeout like a pizza place. We're built for the recreational population," Mr. Zuccaro said.

He said many people like to blame people from out-of-town that come to the area for ATV riding for any bad behavior on the trails, but at this time of year, it's mainly local riders he sees ignoring the rules. There isn't much that can be done about it from his point of view.

What he can do, however, is allow the trail to be rerouted so that his land can be used to make up for the gap where Mr. Ehlers land was being used.

"It turns out that the railroad bed can connect with my property. I already donate the back half of my property for it," Mr. Zuccaro said,

All trails in the county are currently closed because of the COVID-19 crisis, Mrs. Mahoney said, and they aren't

pushing for an early opening because "people don't listen."

"While people are riding, there isn't a problem because they are more than six feet apart, but we don't want them congregating in parking lots or around the restaurants that are still serving takeout food."

Although seasonal roads are technically open all year round as far as county law goes, Mrs. Mahoney said each town has their own provisions regarding use of those roads.

The new work-around of the trail near Burdicks Crossing Road to include the Zuccaro's property may take until at least June 3 for final approval.

Until then, Mrs. Mahoney asked riders to respect landowners and follow the law.

Also, if you know any landowners in the area between Village of Boonville over to the Milk Plant or up to the Lewis County Trails that might allow a trail on their property, please contact us.


